9. Women's Grievance Cell



- To maintain the safety and security of girls and women, a cell has been constituted for the redressal of grievances. Our Women's Grievance Cell always remains vigilant to prevent any form of sexual abuse against students and female workers. If students face harassment from staff or workers, they can file a complaint with our Women's Grievance Cell. The members will investigate the issues, gather evidence, and take the necessary action against the guilty parties. We also focus on preventing such harassment by using discreet monitoring services, which keep a close watch on the entire campus.
- This cell is responsible for maintaining records of grievances, actions taken, and the settlement of grievances. The cell is headed by the principal and includes the Administrative Officer and six female faculty members. A grievance box is placed in the girls' waiting rooms, where students can drop their complaints, if any. The box is opened once a month for review. Any grievances found are scrutinized, and necessary actions are promptly taken by the cell. In case of emergencies, the principal convenes a meeting to address the problems immediately. Over the past two years, the cell has been effectively resolving grievances raised by female students, and the issues have been settled amicably.

- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student to complete academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Engaging in financial extortion or imposing forceful financial burdens on a fresher or any other student.
- Any act of physical abuse, including but not limited to sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene or lewd acts or gestures, causing bodily harm, or endangering health or safety.
- Verbal abuse, whether spoken, written (emails, posts), or public insults, including deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill, by actively or passively participating in causing discomfort to a fresher or any other student.
- Any act that impacts the mental health or self-confidence of a fresher or any other student, whether intentionally or otherwise, through sadistic pleasure, or demonstrating power, authority, or superiority over them.

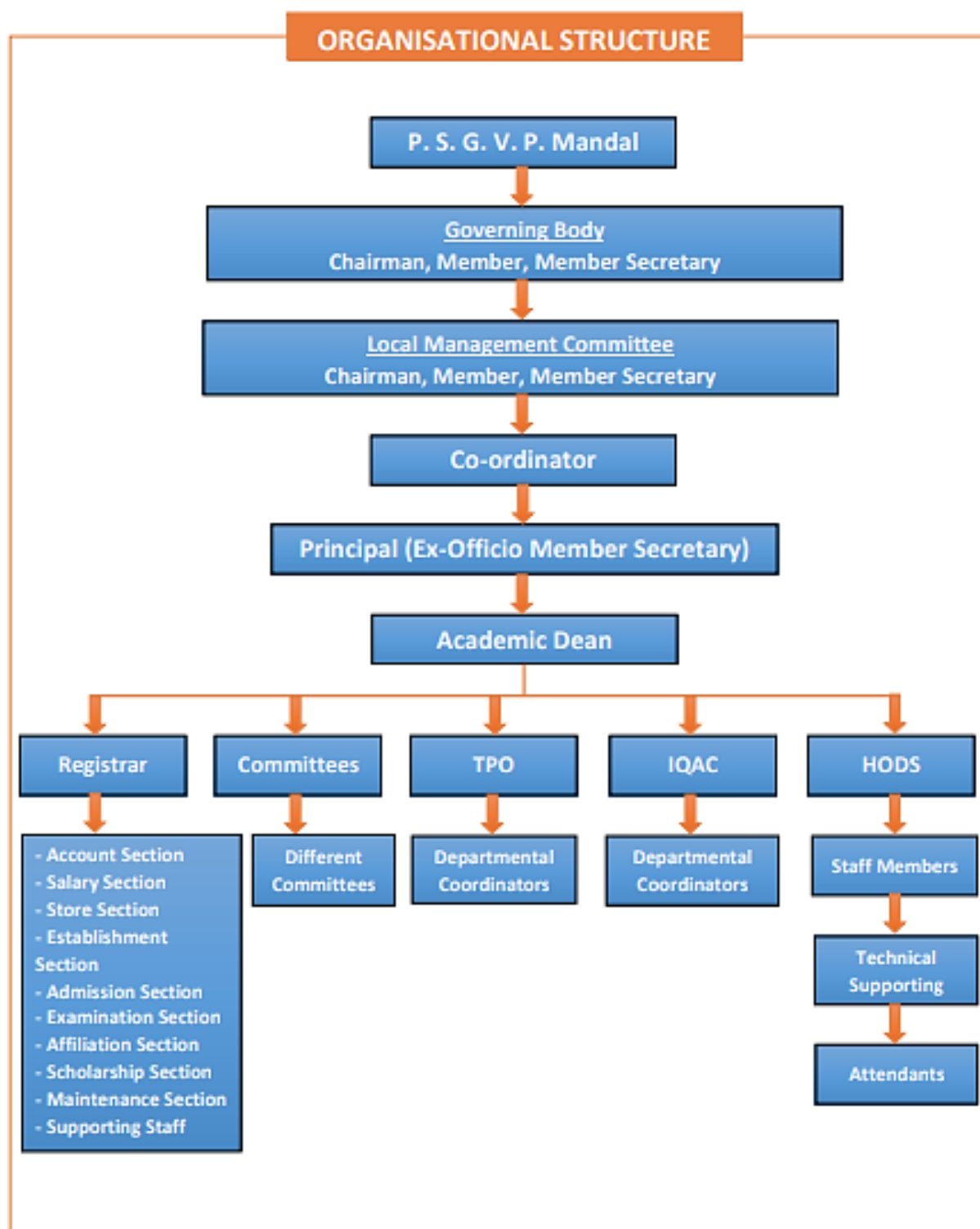

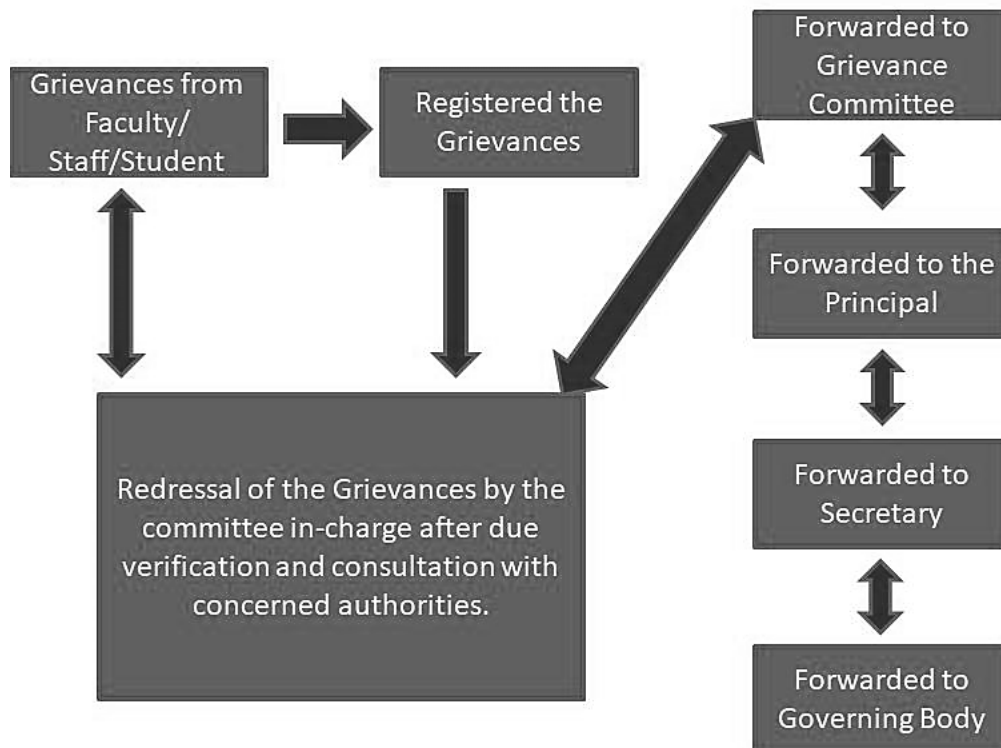
15. Organization Chart

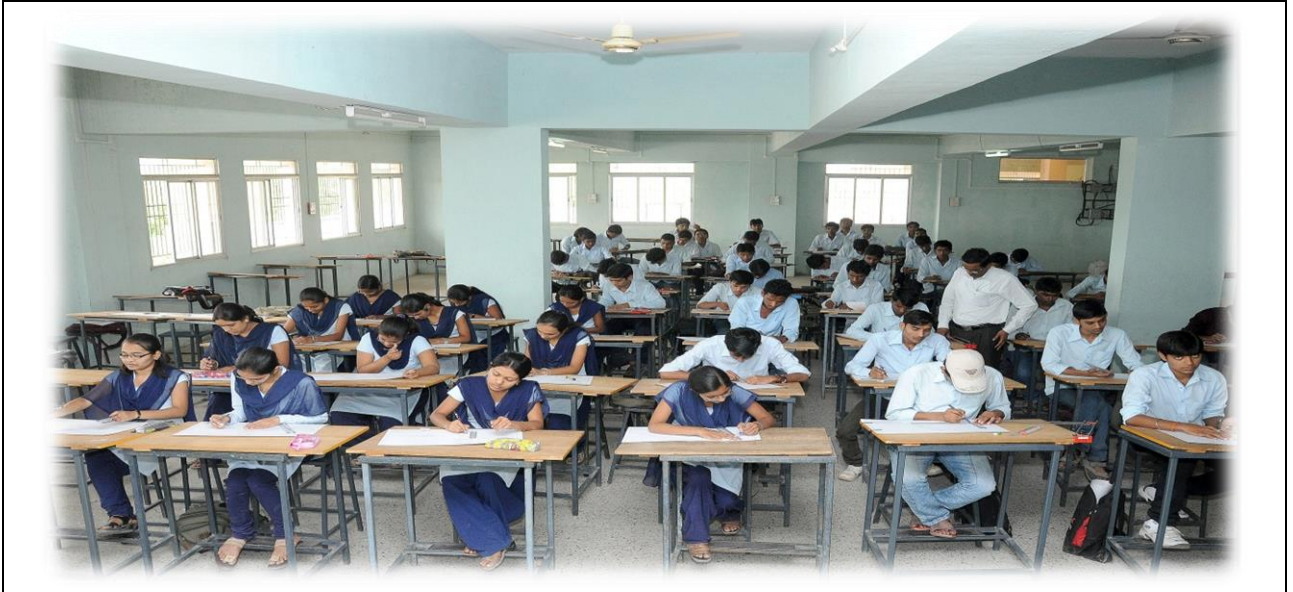
